Rec Center

Pool:

The pool is open! We lost one pump and some of the solar panels but the pool will still be heated via boiler. A replacement pump is on order and solar panels will be replaced.

Spa:

New Spa covers ordered in January were damaged in transport and sent back for repair. No ETA for delivery. We will attempt to create temporary covers.

New Rec Equipment:

New Stationary Bike and Weight Bench delivery are TBD.

Landscape Plans

- Repair extensive damage from the winter snows
- Remove Bender Board from pathways to eliminate safety concerns
- Do landscape enhancements (TBD once damage is repaired)

Firewise

Did you know that you may be able to get a discount on your insurance because we are a certified Firewise community? The certificate is posted on our website.

Projects this year will include new, reflective house numbers and 1/8" vent screening.

Painting

The five single-family condos, Rec Center, and three more buildings are scheduled to be painted or stained this summer. There will also be some building touch-up, and around 25 decks that will receive touch up.

While we don't yet have a firm schedule, owners will be notified in advance so they can close windows and remove items from decks.

Roofs

The HOA has engaged three consultants to provide us with a proposal to do a thorough investigation of our roofs and offer recommendations for how to mitigate the occurrence of ice dams in our community. We expect to receive those proposals by June 15 and will select one to do the investigation and make written recommendations. Once we get those recommendations we will use them to guide our actions.

Some units may experience loss of heating capability because snow is covering the vent. Work to extend those vents has begun and should be completed this year.

Repair of heat tape and gutters will again be a priority this summer. Our challenge once again is getting contractors to do the work (electricians, autters, heat tape, etc.).

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Signs

As you may have noticed, we have received our new street signs. These will be installed during June.

The planned monument sign is awaiting approval from the Town of Truckee.
